

SOME BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Otago/Southland Society was established in 1944 - one of the first of the current eight affiliated Societies of the Amputees Federation of NZ Inc. Formed with the intention of lobbying for a free limb service (The cost was previously met by the amputee), the Federation's prime focus in today's changing health and social welfare system is to ensure that present services are retained. This includes ensuring that amputees are provided with the best possible limbs and the best possible service in the way of fitting and repairs etc, and that these remain free of charge.

The Otago and Southland Society has approximately 200 members. It is administered by a Committee based in Dunedin - membership of the committee includes people from Southland and other areas outside Dunedin.

WE NEED EACH OTHER

Amputees are as vulnerable as every other user of the health system. There may not always be funding available to provide service when we need it. As the Government recognised organisation representing the amputee consumer, the degree of clout that the National Federation has in lobbying on behalf of all amputees throughout NZ will be gauged by the number of members backing it.

SERVICES PROVIDED BY OUR SOCIETY

The Amputee Society of Otago & Southland Inc. offers a wide range of support services to assist amputees, their families, whanau and friends. Included in these are:

- Hospital and home visits.
- A quarterly newsletter, together with the national magazine, *Purpose*.
- Information on support available to amputees.
- A welfare Fund to provide financial assistance to members in need.
- Coordination of visits by Limb Centre staff to Invercargill. These enable amputees in Southland to consult limb-fitters and have adjustments made to limbs without having to travel to the Limb Centre in Dunedin.
- Social functions in Dunedin and Invercargill provide an opportunity to meet other amputees and discuss common problems.
