Taxi Vouchers - In the last newsletter we advised that the Mobility Vouchers can be used for the Driving Miss Daisy taxi service in Alexandra. This now applies also to the Driving Miss Daisy taxi service in Oamaru (phone 434-8421). A significant difference with Driving Miss Daisy (available also in Dunedin) is that the driver will provide personal assistance, e.g. attending a doctor's appointment, helping with shopping etc. The vouchers, which entitle you to a 50% discount on taxis, are available from me (Otago members) or in Southland you will need to complete an initial application form available from Maurice & Mavis Elford (215-6715). Once on the register, you then contact Lisa Griffiths at the Invercargill City Council (211-1777) for your supply of vouchers. A reminder to everyone that our taxi vouchers can be used anywhere in NZ, including cities such as Auckland where they use swipe cards.

UR GRANTS

Applications are invited for grants from the following funds:

Meffan and Pankhurst Funds - Welfare grants up to a maximum of \$300 in any one year can be made from these funds to help improve independence and quality of life. Some examples of purposes for which grants can be made are: health and medical services; subsidising of travel over and above Total Mobility taxi vouchers; the cost of hiring a mobility scooter; home comforts, e.g. wood, coal etc; assistance towards the installation of a heat pump or the cost of ceiling and underfloor insulation and heating; equipment which will assist independence and/ or mobility.

Coyle Young Achievers' Fund - Grants up to \$500 can be made to young people up to the age of 30 to help with cultural and sporting interests and hobbies. Young people are encouraged to get in touch with the Coordinator or a Committee member to discuss possibilities.

Application Forms for all grants are available from the Coordinator and will be considered by the Finance Sub Committee after the closing date of 31 May. Applicants must have been a financial member of the Society for at least two years and, if successful, grants will be paid only upon the supply of a quote or invoice, with payment made to the service provider.
